

Curriculum Horizons

6-7 July

Under the theme "Curriculum Horizons" the Conference will explore the present and prospective role of philosophy in the school curriculum. This includes both discussion and presentation of recent curriculum developments and initiatives, curriculum related research, developments in teaching philosophy in the classroom, new teaching materials, and discussion of philosophy as a Key Learning Area within the National Curriculum Framework.

Some basic information about the conference is provided below, and a Conference Booking Form is attached for your convenience.

LOCATION: The Conference will be held in the charming surroundings of Sancta Sophia College at the University of Sydney. The neo-Gothic buildings of the College are set in pleasant grounds, just a few minutes walk from shops and restaurants and within easy reach of the city. The College is about 15 minutes by taxi from Sydney Airport, depending upon the traffic. See the enclosed map for details.

ACCOMMODATION: Accommodation will be available at the College for those who require it, although booking is essential. The College has both single and twin serviced rooms, with bathroom facilities on each floor. There is an excellent dining hall and parking is available. Please ensure that you indicate your needs when returning the Conference Booking Form.

PROGRAM: A detailed program for the Conference will be sent to participants before the end of May. Registration will commence at 9.00am on the Saturday, followed at 9.30 by the Keynote Address delivered by Dr Laurance Splitter from the Centre of Philosophy for Children at the Australian Council for Educational Research. The first day will include individual presentations, panel discussions and workshops, ending at 4.30pm. There will be similar sessions on the Sunday morning between 10.00am and 1.00pm, followed after lunch by the FAPCA Annual General Meeting. Lunch and morning and afternoon tea and coffee will be provided for everyone attending the conference.

CONFERENCE DINNER: A conference dinner will be held on the Saturday evening at 7.00 for 7.30 at a restaurant in nearby King Street. The evening should be a very enjoyable one and everyone attending the conference is warmly invited to attend.
